Larry Gibbs is Associate Vice-Provost for Environmental Health and Safety at Stanford University, where he is responsible for all health, safety, environmental risk management programs and institutional emergency planning. Stanford has ~2500 laboratories on its campus involved in over \$700 million of research ranging from basic sciences to nanomaterials to medicine and human subjects clinical research. Larry is also a lecturer at the Woods Institute for the Environment at Stanford and serves on the Stanford Board of Overseers for the SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory, where he chairs the Board's Operations Oversight Committee. He has graduate degrees in science education from Boston University and in industrial hygiene and public health from the University of Michigan.

Mr. Gibbs is a certified industrial hygienist with over 29 years of experience in developing and managing EH&S programs for academic, research and clinical institutions. In addition to his work at the universities, he serves as a consultant for industrial, pharmaceutical, biotechnology and government organizations. He has authored over 25 publications on health, safety and environmental management, and co-authored two books. Larry is active in a number of professional organizations. Larry is Immediate Past Chair of the ACGIH[®], serves on the Board of Regents of the National Association of EH&S Managers (NAEM), and is a Fellow of the American Industrial Hygiene Association. He has also served previously on the Executive Council of the Campus Safety, Health and Environmental Management Association (CSHEMA) and on the Board of the American Biological Safety Association (ABSA).
