TITLE: Occupational Safety and Health: Valley Fever
SUMMARY:
Requires the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board to adopt occupational safety and health standards for state public works projects to prevent and control coccidioidomycosis, more commonly known as Valley Fever.

SUMMARY:
Requires primary health clinics and general acute care hospitals to develop, adopt, and implement policies and procedures for the purpose of preventing, diagnosing, and treating Coccidioidomycosis infections no later than a specified date. Requires primary health clinics and general acute care hospitals to ensure that medical professionals and other personnel providing patient care receive sufficient training regarding those policies and procedures.

SUMMARY:
Appropriates funds from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery for organic waste recycling infrastructure projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and solid waste recycling infrastructure projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Specifies activities that expand and improve waste diversion and recycling include food rescue, waste prevention, and organic waste recycling.

Requires the Department of Finance to include in the investment plan specified information on the applications received.

Requires the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery to establish the South Bay Interagency Odor Taskforce, with a specified membership, to identify sources of odor emissions and nuisance complaints based on odor emissions received by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District and the Cities of Milpitas, Fremont, Santa Clara and San Jose. Requires the taskforce to take specified actions developing and implementing a protocol for inspections of odor complaints.

SUMMARY:

Relates to existing law which requires that actions for civil penalties or punitive damages relating to hazardous waste and hazardous substances be commenced within 5 years after the discovery by the agency bringing the action. Includes actions relating to aboveground storage of petroleum within the 5-year limitations period.

SUMMARY:

Requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control to adopt regulations establishing inspection frequencies for permitted hazardous waste treatment, storage, and disposal facilities, hazardous waste generators, and hazardous waste transporters. Requires the inspection frequency for a hazardous waste land disposal facility to be no less than 2 times per calendar year.

SUMMARY:

Expands the time period for the expenditure of appropriated moneys relating to the cleanup and investigation of properties contaminated with lead in the communities surrounding the Exide Technologies facility. Appropriates additional moneys from the Toxic Substances Control Account for the interim removal or remedial action in public parkway sites in those same communities with dangerous lead levels.

Vests the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery with the primary responsibility for the disposal of home-generated pharmaceutical waste and would require the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery, in collaboration with the State Department of Public Health, the Department of Toxic Substances control, and the California State Board of Pharmacy, to adopt regulations authorizing the incineration of home-generated pharmaceutical waste by solid waste facilities.

SUMMARY:

Amends existing law relating to occupational safety and health. Requires employers to file specified injury and illness forms electronically with the Division of Occupational Health and Safety. Requires the Division to develop a searchable database for one of those forms on its web site. Requires the Division to pose those forms on the database within a certain number of days of their receipt. Requires the Division to maintain the records submitted by employers for a certain number of years.

SUMMARY:

Requires, for hazardous waste facilities permit that will expire on or before a specified date, the owner or operator of a facility intending to extend the term of that permit to submit to a Part A and Part B application for permit renewal at least 6 months before the fixed term of the permit expires.

TITLE: Lead Exposure: Child Daycare Facilities

SUMMARY:

Amends existing law relating to the Safe Drinking Water Act and the Child Care and Development Services Act. Specifies that a licensed child day care center is eligible to apply for, and to receive, loan funding for improvements from the Revolving Fund. Requires a licensed child day care center that receives loan funding to demonstrate both a financial need and a lack of reasonable alternative funding sources.

SUMMARY:

Requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control to process a hazardous waste facilities permit renewal application in an expedited manner, as provided, if the department determines that certain conditions are met, including that operations at the hazardous waste facility have not changed significantly since the approval of the permit in effect at the time the renewal application is submitted. Imposes a maximum on the amount of reimbursement to the department for the costs incurred.

SUMMARY:

Imposes certain requirement on a retailer or manufacturer who transfers or ships a surplus household consumer product, as defined by the bill, to a reverse distributor. Authorizes a reverse distributor to receive a surplus household consumer product to evaluate the product for reuse, donation, transfer for credit, and other specified purposes. Authorizes a reverse distributor to transfer the product for recycling or disposal only after first evaluating the product for all of the other specified purposes.

SUMMARY:

Authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board to establish a grant program to provide funding to a county or qualified nonprofit organization, as specified, to provide low-interest loans to defined property owners for the replacement of corroded or lead-containing plumbing and service lines that adversely impact drinking water standards for the installation of a point-of-use or point-of-entry water treatment system, as specified.

Requires an applicant for a state license under the Medicinal and Adult-Use Cannabis Regulation and Safety Act (MAUCRSA) to provide a statement that the applicant employs, or will employ within one year of receiving a license, one supervisor and one employee who have successfully completed the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal-OSHA) 30-hour general industry course given by a Cal-OSHA authorized training provider.

Requires that the report constitute an allegation of a serious violation and subject the employment or place of employment to an investigation, as provided, by the division, and requires the division to make any citations or fines imposed as a result of the investigation publicly available on an annual basis.
