Requires every current emergency ambulance employee and every new employee hired on or after January 2020, within 6 months of being hired, to attend a 6-hour training on violence prevention that includes, among other things, understanding the types of anger, proven and effective verbal de-escalation skills, and hands-on demonstrations, workshops, and role-playing scenarios.

Requires the State Department of Public Health to consider a report from a laboratory of an employee's blood lead level at or above 20 micrograms per deciliter to be injurious to the health of the employee and to report that case within 5 business days of receiving the report to the Division of Occupational safety and Health. Provides that the report would constitute a serious violation and subject the employer or place of employment to an investigation by the division.

Provides that the training is not required during the first year that the county is listed as highly endemic, but would be required in subsequent years.

Prohibits participation in a lead paint abatement program from being considered as evidence that a property constitutes a nuisance, or is substandard or untenable.

Provides that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines mandated costs are included, reimbursement shall be made pursuant to statutory provisions.
