Legislative Advocate Activities Report (Cathy)	<ul> <li>S weeks away (May 24th) for bills leaving house of origin and last chance for language changes; the next bill report will have an update on spot bills and whether they will move; Cathy will talk to members.</li> <li>Chair Smallwood-Cuevas of Senate Labor, Public Employment and Retirement Committee (SLPERC) may be able to take proposed CIHC bill; however, SLPERC staff director (Alma Perez) commented that our bill is too self-serving; may be able to help with language.</li> <li>Senator Lola Smallwood-Cuevas – member to sponsor our resolution; Senator Niello still willing to do it, but may not have time.</li> <li>AB 2264 (Arambula) – heat illness protection; interested in working with us to amend the bill</li> <li>Bill dropped for this session; may be reintroduced in December</li> <li>Bill Report:</li> <li>Bill report as of May 3rd provided by email to Board.</li> </ul>	Ed to provide an updated bill report after May 24 <sup>th</sup> legislative deadline.  All check your bills to see if we need to update our position

6.	Cal/OSHA Activity (All)	<ul> <li>No new updates on lead revisions or silica ETS standards (both were adopted by Standards Board)</li> <li>New version of lead standards have not been posted to Title 8</li> <li>Megan and Pam attended the April Standards Board meeting in San Diego; there was an organized protest regarding the lack of action on the Indoor Heat Illness regulation.</li> <li>Indoor Heat Illness regulation</li> <li>Dept of Corrections took issue with SRIA; not correctly done for public agencies.</li> <li>Office of Administrative Law still needs to provide opinion on whether the Standards Board vote to adopt the regulation (taken against direction to pull the vote from the meeting agenda) will stand.</li> <li>Fall Protection – Residential Construction</li> <li>6-foot trigger for fall protection in Federal rule, but implemented a stay 20+ years ago.</li> <li>As a result Cal/OSHA implemented its own standard for 15-foot trigger that has been in effect all this time.</li> <li>Now Feds say discrepancy between Fed and Cal for "at least as effective as".</li> <li>There is a rulemaking package making its way through the process.</li> <li>No report on Cal/OSHA Advisory Committee; meeting for March canceled; still no Chief hired; Debra Lee is Acting Chief.</li> </ul>	Meg and Pam to attend May Standards Board Meeting in Sacramento.
7.	Local Section Activity (All)	Tabled	Board reps to share CIHC activities with Local Sections.
8.	New Business (All)	Howard provided a review of his comments on lead standard and Cal/OSHA's response to his comments; all comments and responses are in the rulemaking documents that were prepared by Cal/OSHA for the lead regulations revisions, and provided for Standards Board consideration prior to voting. These are public documents.  General discussion on the primary issue of who is "competent in industrial hygiene practice" and CIHC responsibility to pursue an answer.  Option to ask for legislative counsel opinion regarding application of §5155(e)(3)	Board to review the email Howard sent regarding lead comments  Howard and Cathy will investigate obtaining a legislative counsel opinion, and will review CIHC's current proposed bill language.
