OSHA Activity

- Reporting Severe Illness & Injuries
 FINAL Effective Jan 1, 2015
 - Old Report Fatalities & Hospitalization of 3+ within 8 hrs.
 - ■New Fatalities within 8 hrs, but all eye loss, hospitalization, amputations within 24 hrs.

Electronic Reporting Now Allowed
Plus – Updated List of Exempt Industries



- Small Business Review Started October 22
 - •60 Days to File Report (December)
 - ■Then the Public Process (10 yrs for silica)
 - Could Cover Any Employer
 - •Requires OH Professional?
- •Need Now More Than Ever?
 - CDC Problems
 - Illegal Immigrant Concerns
 - Ebola





Beryllium

- Labor / Industry Agreement
- Focus on General Industry
- •Reduce PEL
 - 2.0 micrograms per cubic meter to 0.2
- Sent to White House for Review

Some Think –
PEL Should Be Lower
Should Include Construction

NPRM - 01/15



Permissible Exposure Limits (PELs)

- OSHA Publishes Annotated Tables
 - ■PELs RELs TLVs CA/OSHA PELs
- FACOSH
- RFI on October 10
 - Options?
 - Control Banding?
 - •General Duty Clause?
 - Can They Be Updated?
 - ■Tough Nut to Crack
 - Likely Years Away



 - ■250+ Quarterly
 - ■20+ Annually
