

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

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

Dear Colleagues:

The results of these initial efforts ultimately led to Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) title protection, definition of industrial hygiene in the Business and Professions code, and additional regulatory and legislative recognition of the important role industrial hygienists play in the anticipation, recognition, evaluation, and control of hazards in the workplace and environment.

However, our work is not done. As new laws and regulations are proposed, it is important for industrial hygienists to continue to be active in the process and ensure our contributions continue to be recognized. The need to educate legislators and their staff about "What is an industrial hygienist?" is no less important today than it was two plus decades ago.

The CIHC Board can always use assistance. Please consider getting involved, or at least send an email with your thoughts and concerns! The Board is actively seeking technical advisors. The Board consults with technical advisors to gather information and details on specific issues that will assist the Board in commenting on proposed legislative bills and draft regulations. - Negotiated to reduce the number of days for lead training course for CIHs to three days
- Negotiated the exemption for Trauma Scene Waste Management Practitioner requirement
- Monitored rewrite of the Professional Engineers Act
- Sponsored laboratory accreditation legislation
- Sponsored successful legislation to allow a CIH or other qualified professional to provide lead poisoning prevention services
- Garnered strategic legislative amendments to the Toxic Mold Protection Act of 2001 assuring the participation of IH's in developing standards to identify, evaluate, and abate mold
- Provided comments on a wide range of proposed regulations: heat illness prevention, green chemistry, lead in construction and general industry, hazard communication, ergonomics (housekeeping in hotel and hospitality facilities), injury and illness prevention, respirable crystalline silica, permissible exposure limits




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

Growing up in the Midwest, I knew snow in the summer was impossible, and decided that Colorado was enchanted. 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












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
